Dress children in layers — eg vest, top and jumper — with plenty of extras for going outside. Thick welly socks can really help, as can gloves, hats and warm waterproof coats. We have plenty of wellies and waterproof trousers for children to wear. If your child comes to Esklets in their own wellies, could you please pack a pair of shoes or slippers for them to change into.
