WELCOME!

Welcome, or welcome back, to all our children and their families. I hope that you have had a lovely summer, despite the damp weather. A few of you used our summer holiday club, which was lots of fun — we look forward now to having everyone back into normal routine.

This newsletter has lots of reminders for you, for the year ahead!

Contact details -

Please can you let us know if any of your details have changed. It is important that we have up-to-date contact details in case of emergencies.

Opening Hours -

We are open Monday – Friday in school termtime, from 8.30-4.00. Please see the calendar of term dates on our website. We are entitled to a set number of 'Professional Development' days through the year, when we are closed to children. These are taken as the first Monday of each term (4^{th} September, 8^{th} January, 15^{th} April), the last Friday of the Autumn term (22^{nd} December) and the last Monday of the summer term (22^{nd} July).

Changing your child's hours/days —Please let us know as soon as possible if you want to change your child's days or hours. We work out fees at the beginning of the month, so need to know when your child will be attending. Funded hours can only be changed at the start of each term.

Dropoff and Collection

Please try to ensure timely drop off and collection of your child. We are unable to have children in the setting before 8.30 as we are busy getting the nursery ready for the children. Similarly at the end of the day, once children have gone, we still have to tidy up and clean before we can leave, so much as we like the children, please collect them by 4!!! Obviously if there is ever an emergency we would wait with children for as long as needed, but for children who are persistently collected late we would have to charge a fee as stated in our policy. This also applies for children with shorter hours within our opening times as staffing levels are set according to the

number of children we expect to be with us (ie if you have your child booked in from 9.00, please don't arrive at 8.45!)

When coming into nursery, unless it is a special event (like introducing a new adult who can pick up your child) please can only ONE ADULT come in with a child. If you need to bring older siblings with you, please keep them by you near the door. It makes it much harder for us to ensure all children are safe and happy when we are crowded with extra people.

Please keep your child with you on collection and leave the building together – don't let them run outside and play on the equipment.

Toys from home -

Toys from home can cause all sorts of problems — they can get lost, broken, forgotten.... If possible don't bring any toys from home to Esklets.

Photos -

We are going to update our photos from home display. Please email, message or send in any photos of your children with their families, pets or doing favourite activities.

What to send with your child -

Please could all children bring a small bag with a spare set of clothes in. We do have clothes that children can get changed into, but sometimes these don't come back to the setting (socks especially!) Other things that we would suggest putting in their bag are: a sun hat, their own sun cream if you use a specific brand (we do have sun cream in the setting), a pair of shoes if you send your child in wellies. We go outside every day, so please send your child in weather appropriate clothing that you don't mind getting very dirty. Please send nappies, wipes etc if your child needs them.

Packed Lunches -

A polite reminder that Esklets promotes healthy eating, so please do not send your child with chocolate, sweets or crisps. We offer children milk and water through the day, so you do not need to send them a drink, and all children are offered a midmorning fruit snack and a healthy afternoon snack. If you need any advice on healthy eating, you can either speak to Vicky or Rachel or look at our website.

Policies

Please take the time to read our policies on the website <u>www.eskletspreschool.co.uk</u> - they cover all areas of nursery, from what to do in an emergency and what to do if your child is ill, to the way we change nappies, prepare food and educate your children.

Fees - Fees are not increasing from last term.

Tax-Free Childcare and Government funding

Do you know about the Government's Tax-Free Childcare Scheme? It is a scheme to help families with childcare costs. Visit www.childcarechoices.co.uk to find out if you are eligible. For every £8 you pay towards your childcare costs, the government will top it up to £10. You can claim this from when your child is born up to when they are 11. This website is also where you can find out about extended hours funding for 3&4 year olds, and the funding offer for some 2 year olds. If you claim 30 hours please don't forget to update your code when prompted, otherwise it can expire. The new government funding for younger children starts to be rolled out next April. Staff —
